LEGAL NOTICE

Pursuant to the dispositions of article 6 III 1° of the law n°2004-575 of June 21st 2004 for trust in the electronic economy, we inform you that:

- The present website, accessible at the URL address www.missing.net (hereinafter the "Site") is published by the Fondation Casques Rouges, an interim association in activity in Paris in the form of an association as defined by the law of July 1st 1901, with legal domicile at 1 rue Descartes, 75005 Paris, France.

This Confidentiality Charter (the "Charter") governs the collection, treatment and safeguarding of personal data on the Site www.missing.net.

For the purposes of the present Charter, the "Casques Rouges", "we" and "our" designate the Fondation Casques Rouges.

For the purposes of the present Charter, the "member", "you" and "your" designate the user of the Site and the services offered thereon.

This Charter is intended to clarify what are personal data concerning both Users and missing persons following a natural, industrial, epidemiological, environmental or ecological disaster (the "Disaster") which we collect, how we protect them and how we use them.

Please read what follows before starting to use the Site.

Registration on the Site and access to services provided thereon (the "Services") imply your full and unreserved acceptance of the terms of the present Charter as regularly updated.

This Charter applies solely to data collected by the Site, notably at the time of your registration. We are not responsible for the confidentiality of the information which you reveal or post on a public forum and which may be collected by sites which you can access via the Site or which gave you access to the Site, but which are exploited or held by third parties.

The Casques Rouges encourage you to examine the privacy policies of these other web sites so that you can understand how they collect, use and share information concerning you.

1. THE COLLECTING OF PERSONAL DATA

Your personal details consist of information which concerns you and identifies you or makes it possible to identify you, for example your name, your e-mail address, your address or telephone number ("Personal data"). You can browse certain pages of the Site without registering as a member. In that case, we will not handle personal data concerning you, but we may use non-personal information as indicated below.

In order to access the Site and services occasionally available on the Site, you must register on the Site and create an account in compliance with the applicable regulatory dispositions and with the Terms of Use. At the time of creation of your account you will be asked to provide the following information:

- Surname
- First name
- Email adress
- Date of birth
- Email address
- Organisation
- Telephone number
- Fax number
- Address
- City
- Postal Zip
- Country

In order to complete your registration, we will need you to provide us with personal details which will include, among other things, your name, your address, your e-mail address and a password.

We will use your Personal data in compliance with stipulations of this Confidentiality Charter

You can at any moment modify and update the information of your account by modifying your account settings or by sending an e-mail to the following address: contact@missing.net

2. THE COLLECTING OF NON-PERSONAL INFORMATION

In addition to personal data, we can collect and save the traces of details which by themselves cannot be used to identify or contact you, for example, demographic information (such as the age, profession or sex), domain names, your type of computer, the type of browser you use as well as other anonymous statistical data ("Non-Personal Information"). We use this Non-Personal Information in order to help us understand who our users are, and to improve and promote the Site in order to facilitate the search for missing persons following a Disaster.

We can collect Non-Personal Information, even if you choose not to register on the Site. We collect this information by using tracking tools consisting of various Internet technologies, notably "cookies", "tags" and "JavaScript" (jointly "Tracking tools").

These Tracking tools are files which are placed on your computer in order to identify your Web browser as well as your activity on the Site. These Tracking tools enable us to develop a profile of your preferences on the Site. In this way we can personalise and improve your visits to the Site.

You have the possibility of refusing cookies using your browser settings. You can turn off cookies by using the appropriate function of your browsing software by setting your browser in the following manner:

- For Mozilla Firefox:
Choose the "tools" menu then "Options"
Click on the "privacy" icon
Find the "cookies" menu and select the options which suits you

- For Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.0:
Choose the "Tools" menu, then "Internet Options"
Click on the "Confidentiality" tab,
Select the desired level of the cursor.

- For Microsoft Internet Explorer 5:
Choose the "Tools" menu, then "Internet Options".
Click on the "Security" tab,
Select "Internet" then "CustomLevel",
Find the "cookies" heading and choose the option which suits you.

- For Opera 6.0 and later:
Choose the "File" menu then "Preferences"

However, if cookies are turned off, you might not be able to benefit from all the Site's functions.

3. USE OF PERSONAL DETAILS

Your Personal details will be primarily used in pursuance of our activity, in order to use the Site's Services and functions as well as for any question in reasonable connection with this usage.

We may also use your Personal data for the following general purposes: for general communication with yourself, to reply to your questions and comments, to resolve claims, to prevent potentially forbidden or illegal activities, to inform you about our activities, to carry out the Terms of Use or for any other reason described in the paragraph concerning collecting.

If you do not wish to receive e-mails or other mail from the Casques Rouges, you may simply indicate this by your account settings or in writing to the following address:

Lastly, we can use your Personal data in order to offer you additional services.

By way of example, we may send you newsletters, with the aim of informing you of the latest Site news and Services which we offer to aid the search for missing persons. If you no longer wish to receive our newsletters, you can choose not to receive any more by sending an e-mail to the e-mail address given above. You can also follow the unsubscribe link found in every newsletter.

Unless you give your express permission to do so, we do not share, sell, exchange or hire your Personal details.

We reserve the right to use your Personal data in order to communicate with you on subjects relating to the state of your account, modifications of this Charter, or of any other Charter or agreements concerning the use of the Site.

4. YOUR RIGHTS CONCERNING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

All Personal details you communicate to us are strictly confidential.

We want the Personal data which we keep concerning you to be as exact as possible. You can access your Personal data and update the information directly on the Site using your chosen login and password.

In compliance with articles 39 and 40 of the law N°78-17 of January 6th 1978 relating freedom of digital information as modified in 2004, the treatment of Personal data collected on the Site has been cited in a declaration to the Commission Nationale de l'Informatique et des Libertés (pending)

You have the right to access, modify, rectify, update or delete your Personal data. To exercise one of these rights, you must send a postal letter or e-mail to the Fondation Casques Rouges at the following addresses:

indicating your surname, first name(s), address(es). To comply with current regulations, the request should be signed and accompanied by a photocopy of proof of identity bearing the signature and must state the address to which you wish the reply to be sent. A reply will then be sent within two (2) months from receipt of the request.

You may also consult or modify the personal data of your account by visiting the Site and by modifying your account settings.

5. SECURITY MEASURES FOR PROTECTING YOUR PERSONAL DATA

In return for the trust placed in us by the Internet user when he connects to the Site, the Casques Rouges are careful to protect the Personal data which they collect.

We have thus set up various security measures to try to ensure that the Personal data you supply to us remains confidential and protected against any loss, improper use, unauthorised access, disclosure, alteration or destruction. Nevertheless, there is no such thing as a perfect or infallible system of security. We are not able to oversee the actions of other members with whom you have decided to share your Personal data. We can therefore not guarantee that your Personal data will be seen only by authorised persons. Nor can we guarantee that the Personal data you share on the Site will not become public. We are not in any case responsible for the non-respect of the Charter or of the security measures in force on the Site by a third party. You can reduce these risks by using commonsense security practices such as creating a difficult password, using different passwords and keeping your antivirus software up to date.

6. CHECKS

Your attention is drawn to the fact that automatic and generalised checks may be carried out to limit malfunctioning, in compliance with the rules in force.

In case of malfunctioning detected by the Site staff or by one or more members, a manual check may be carried out to verify any operations performed by one or more users.

7. TRANSFER OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA OUTSIDE THE EU

The Personal data which we collect can be transferred and stored outside France and the European Union (UE). All the same, we will ensure that these transfers are made to countries (i) offering the same level of protection as the applicable European regulations or (ii) subject to contracts imposing on all parties a level of protection equivalent to that offered by the applicable European regulations.

Your Personal data may also be handled by staff outside the EU who work for us or for one of our suppliers.

In any case, by submitting to us your Personal data, you accept this transfer, storage and treatment outside the European Union.

All recipients of your Personal data shall be bound by obligations of confidentiality guaranteeing a level of security at least equivalent to that offered by European regulations on the protection of personal data.

8. PARTIAL NULLITY

If one or more stipulations of the Charter are held to be void by the competent jurisdiction, the other clauses shall remain fully effective and valid.

9. MODIFICATION

We are free to modify the Charter at any moment. In case of modification of the Charter, the applicable version is that which you accept at the time of your next connection following the modification.

10. APPLICABLE LAW AND COMPETENT JURISDICTION

This Charter is governed by and interpreted in accordance with French law. Any litigation or objection resulting from or concerning this Charter shall be governed by and submitted to French law without taking account of rules of conflicts of law.

In case of litigation relating to the interpretation or execution of this Charter, the Paris Tribunals are competent regardless of plurality of defendants or claims under warranty, including for summary or motion proceedings.
